Our Educators are committed to early years and primary learning that privileges First Nations culture and approaches combined with the best of Western teachings.

All Educators are expected to work within a Community Development framework and may be working on delivering learning as well as undertaking community engagement as part of our Walk, Talk and Act community engagement and planning.



## About You

We are seeking a suitable Degree or recognised equivalent qualification (Ability to register with the Teacher Registration Board of the Northern Territory) and innovative Early & Primary Years Educator with a minimum of 1 year's teaching experience to join our dynamic team.

You must also be willing to live and work in a very remote context and learn some of the local language - Kunwinjku. It requires good practical skills and an ability to be creative in resource development and teaching strategies. Professional and practical support is provided from our Top End office in Darwin.

To be successful in this position, you will have experience organising a learning environment that suits different ages and abilities (multi- aged class) and a demonstrated understanding and commitment to the rights and interests of First Nations people. Ideally, you will be a First Nations person.
