The Remote Health Promotion Officer - Community Development will work within a multidisciplinary team that aims to improve the health and wellbeing outcomes for the community of Marlkawo – West Arnhem. This position will utilise a community development approach as the fundamental method of engagement and consultation with the community.

The Team will develop and implement family health plans with individuals and families and create and deliver responses to population health needs with the local community. The team will work collaboratively with internal and with external partners.

This position will be predominately based in West Arnhem Land to deliver the Children's Ground 'Health in the Hands of the People' to improve the health and wellbeing outcomes for the Marlkawo community.

Accommodation is provided; you will live in a Safari Tent on a Balabala (raised platform) or camping when travelling to other remote communities.
