

About the Job

This position will provide a wide range of health promotion services to families living in five different communities in and around Mparntwe – Alice Springs including remote communities and outstations in Central Australia.

The Health Promotion Specialist will work in a small multi-disciplinary team delivering the Children's Ground Family Health and Wellbeing Framework *Health in the Hands of the People Utnenge, Tyerrtye, Mwerre Atnyenetyeke Iltye Tyerrtye Urrperle–kenhenge* to improve the health and wellbeing outcomes for communities.

The work critically includes the recognition and support of local cultural knowledge systems and practices, and the agency of consumers. The role requires a collaborative approach, working with the team to develop and implement family health plans with individuals and families and create and deliver responses to population health needs with the local community. The team will work collaboratively with internal and external partners.
