

# Frequently Asked Questions

### Is there parking available on site?

PLEASE NOTE: THERE IS NO PUBLIC PARKING AT THE DESERT KNOWLEDGE PRECINCT

Free parking is available at the Alice Springs Turf Club - Park Racecourse South, 2/Pioneer, Stuart Hwy, Alice Springs NT 0870. A shuttle bus will be in operation to transport attendees to the festival grounds.

Attendees can also work from the Alice Springs Turf Club to the Desert Knowledge Precinct along the unsealed bike path.

#### What will the event look like?

Apmerenge-ntyele Festival: From the Land will be held at the Desert Knowledge Precinct - 475 South, Stuart Hwy, Mpartnwe (Alice Springs) NT 0870. The festival includes live music, cultural performances, workshops, panel discussions, kids activities and more. Food and beverage stalls will be on site providing food and drinks.

#### What times are the stages operating?

Performances will begin on the festival stage at 7pm Friday 30 August and 4pm Saturday 31 August.

Please note: On Friday 30 August, the Artwe-kenhe ilthe (Men's Place) will be formally opened by Desert Knowledge Australia, starting at 5pm. This opening is happening at the Desert Knowledge Precinct but at a different site to the festival stage. Ushers will help direct attendees to and from the Men's Place. Music will start at 7pm on the festival stage once the opening of the Men's Place has concluded.

#### Will I be able to purchase food and drinks?

Food and beverage stalls will be on site providing food and drink options both Friday and Saturday. Vegetarian options will be available. Water stations will be available throughout the festival precinct.

#### Who can attend the festival?

Apmerenge-ntyele Festival: From the Land is free to attend for the whole community from 5pm Friday 30 and 4pm Saturday 31 August.

Please note: The festival is open to First Nations people only between 10am-4pm on Saturday 31 August.

#### • Is the festival suitable for young people?

Apmerenge-ntyele Festival: From the Land is a family friendly festival. We welcome people of all ages to attend.

#### • Is this a free event?

Entry to Apmerenge-ntyele Festival: From the Land is free.

We ask that attendees register their attendance by grabbing a ticket here.

We welcome donations from non-First Nations people upon entry to support the funding of Apmerenge-ntyele Festival: From the Land and the operations of Children's Ground.

#### • How can I get to the festival?

Apmerenge-ntyele Festival: From the Land will be held at the Desert Knowledge Precinct 475 South, Stuart Hwy, Mparntwe (Alice Springs) NT 0870.

Public transport and taxi options are available from Mparntwe CBD. If you are driving, free parking is available at the Alice Springs Turf Club.

**Please note:** Gap Road and Stuart Highway will be closed from 4.30-6.30pm Saturday 31 August due to a public event.
